Key Point: Whānau identify major barriers:



Cost

Financial barriers preventing access to essential healthcare services for many whānau.



Racism

Experiences of discrimination and cultural insensitivity within healthcare settings.



Distance to services

Geographic challenges in accessing healthcare, particularly for rural communities.

What whānau want:



Māori-led models



Culturally safe care



Better oral health access

Highlights & Recommendations



Strong performance in cancer treatment timeliness

100% of Māori and Pacific patients received cancer treatment within the 31-day target timeframe.



Urgent attention on immunisation + ED access

Declining immunisation rates and poor ED wait times require immediate intervention strategies.



Transparent and timely data sharing needed

Improved data access from Health NZ is essential for comprehensive monitoring and service improvement.



Whānau insights should guide future commissioning

Centering whānau voices and experiences in healthcare planning and delivery.
